

St John's School — Praise, Rewards & Sanctions Policy

(Whole School: Junior, Senior, Boarding & EYFS)

Updated: June 2025

1. Rationale

At St John's, we believe pupils flourish in a culture of mutual respect, trust and positivity. Praising and rewarding positive behaviour, effort and attitude must always outweigh the need for sanctions. This policy sets out clear expectations for staff, pupils and parents, ensuring a fair and consistent approach across the whole School, including Boarding and the EYFS.

2. Core Principles

- Pupils are encouraged to do their best for their own sense of pride and success ('intrinsic motivation').
- Praise and rewards should be given frequently, genuinely and fairly.
- Sanctions should be reasonable, proportionate, never humiliating, and used only when necessary to help pupils reflect and improve.
- Parents will be kept informed if behaviour becomes an ongoing concern.
- Good behaviour supports the wellbeing and safety of the whole School community.

3. Praise & Rewards

Staff are encouraged to praise and reward pupils whenever they see effort, kindness, resilience or improvement. Examples include:

- Verbal or written praise.
- House Points awarded via iSAMs (Senior School) or class systems (Junior School).
- Letters, phone calls or emails home.
- Certificates in assemblies or Celebration Assemblies.
- Commendations and prizes at Speech Day.
- Displaying good work around the School.
- Boarding: commendations with age-appropriate privileges, e.g. extended sign-out or treats.

4. Rewards System

• Senior School:

House Points are recorded on **iSAMs** by staff. Points add up for individual and House rewards. Staff may award 1–3 House Points per occasion for excellent work, effort or behaviour.



Junior School:

Pupils earn House Points, which are tallied weekly and celebrated in assembly. Certificates (Bronze, Silver, Gold) mark milestones, with parents invited to share in successes.

Boarding:

Boarding commendations are tiered: pupils who go above and beyond may earn treats like ice-cream trips, meals out, or a day's adventure, depending on the number of commendations.

5. Sanctions

While praise comes first, pupils must understand that poor choices have consequences. All staff should deal with minor incidents 'on the spot' wherever possible, using their professional judgement.

Sanctions may include:

- A verbal warning or reminder.
- Moving a pupil's seat.
- Missing a short break or lunchtime privilege.
- Apologising or making amends.
- Detentions for repeated or more serious issues.

6. Behaviour Tracking & Recording

• Senior School:

Misdemeanours are logged on **iSAMs**, using standard codes (e.g. B for Behaviour, H for Homework). Each is graded (1–3) for severity. Tutors, Heads of Year and Senior Leads monitor these regularly to spot patterns and ensure appropriate follow-up.

• Junior School:

Behaviour concerns are recorded by class teachers. Patterns or repeated issues are shared with the Junior Leads and parents as needed.

Boarding:

Incidents are logged in the Boarding Sanctions Book and online records. Points build towards clear, age-appropriate consequences, such as loss of sign-out privileges.

7. Escalation & Ongoing Issues

- Persistent low-level issues or serious incidents are escalated to the relevant Heads of School, Head of Boarding, or Head of School.
- Parents will be informed if a pupil is not responding to initial interventions.
- Report Cards or Behaviour Cards may be used to support pupils who need extra
- Sanction records reset each term to give pupils a fresh start.



8. Key Expectations for Staff

- Apply this policy consistently and fairly.
- Use praise more often than sanctions.
- Never ignore or 'turn a blind eye' to unacceptable behaviour.
- Keep parents informed don't leave surprises for reports or Parents' Evenings.
- Support colleagues: whoever deals with an incident must be backed up by the wider team.

9. Duties & Supervision

All staff share responsibility for supervising pupils. Be visible, proactive and engaged during duties. Patrolling is better than standing still — the aim is to anticipate and prevent issues.

10. Final Note

St John's is a family-oriented School and Boarding community. We know pupils will make mistakes from time to time, it's our job to help them learn from these moments and grow into respectful, resilient young people.
